

- Student satisfaction Survey was carried out using the Google form. A questionnaire comprising of 10 questions/ statements was designed in a Google form and the web link of the same was distributed among the students through class tutors and the responses were collected.
- All the questions were objective type. Questions one to four were about personal information viz. name, class, mobile no. and e-mail id. Question Nos. 5 to 10 were MCQs or statements with five / three responses.
- A total of 70 responses were received within the time specified. The following paragraphs depict the nature of the responses with respect to the questions asked.

*Q.5. The academic activities of the college are held on time.*

- 58%% agreed with the statement whereas 2% strongly agreed to it. The percentage of strong disagreement was 5.6. 2.8% disagreed to the survey question and 29% remained neutral on the statement.

*Q.6. Teachers use ICT for delivering the content*

- 63.8% agreed with the statement whereas 2.9% strongly agreed to it. 27.7 % remained neutral on the statement. A total of 4 % either disagreed or strongly disagreed to the statement.

*Q.7. The College supports co-curricular and extra-curricular activities to a great extent*

- 44.8% of the total respondents agreed to the statement. 23.9% strongly agreed with it. 19.4% remained neutral with the item in question. Rest of the participants disagreed to the statement or strongly disagreed with it.

*Q. 8. Sports facilities are well provided*

- 44.8% strongly agreed that sports facilities are well provided. An additional 13.4% agreed to it. 30% stayed neutral in their opinion.

*Q.9. Are you satisfied with the online teaching in the light of Covid '19*

*This question had invited a mixed response, almost 30% said 'Yes' to the question and 38.8% said 'No' to it. 31% were having a mixed response of 'May be'.*

*Q.10. Are you able to follow the classes through online mode?*

*This question has given an eye opener on the ground situation on the COVID situation. While 43% said 'Yes', 57% said 'No'.*
